FULBOURN PARISH PLAN

In January 2009, "A Parish Plan for Fulbourn" was delivered to all households in the Parish, and this was followed by a public exhibition at the end of the month. The feedback from both the document itself and from the exhibition was very positive. At the exhibition, visitors had the opportunity to talk to members of the working groups about their projects and were also asked to prioritise the actions they had identified.

It was from this that the completed action plans contained in this book took shape. This democratic exercise gave the Steering Committee, with members of the working groups a solid base from which to work with the Parish Council, to formulate a coherent action plan for the future of Fulbourn which will be continuously reviewed.

This has been very encouraging, as it will help the Parish Council to achieve Quality Status, and also to form a strong partnership with the working groups to carry forward the action plans, which will benefit all Fulbourn residents.

It is hoped that several initiatives will come forward from the Plan. The Patient Participation Group, instigated by the working group addressing Health, had its inaugural meeting on September 10th. The Good Neighbours Scheme suggested by the Steering Committee is progressing well and the Fulbourn Society will soon be formed.

Whilst the Action Plans form the basis of a blueprint for Fulbourn's development over the next decade, we hope that this will not be the end of the process. So much enthusiasm has been generated by this exercise that we believe its influence will last far longer.
