Formed in 1999, Fulbourn Village History Society has maintained a loyal and supportive membership base from amongst local residents of Fulbourn, Cambridgeshire and neighbouring villages.

WHAT WE DO

A brief review of the objectives set down in our Constitution gives some idea of the aims of our Society, and how these are carried out.

The first objective is to research, keep and maintain records of all aspects of the Village's social and historical development.

We have a dedicated secure storage area for Archive material situated in the Committee Room of The Fulbourn Centre, 1 Home End, Fulbourn, CB21 5BS. Opening hours are Monday and Wednesday morning from 10.00 a.m. until noon. During these times, informed help in locating relevant material for research into family and institutions with Fulbourn connections is available.

The second objective is to publish periodic reports on aspects of village history.
